In collaboration with Farmingdale State College's 100th Anniversary, The New York City - Long Island Chapter of APICS, the Association for Operations Management, will be celebrating its 50th Anniversary at the next Professional Development Meeting scheduled for Tuesday, January 24, 2012. Since 1961, The NYC-LI chapter has helped local companies build and validate knowledge in supply chain and operations management. The topic for the evening's presentation is *"Redefining Manufacturing: 8 Critical Issues That Will Shape the Future."* Pervasive, long-term trends such as globalization, changing consumer demographics and new competition from emerging economies are re-shaping the landscape of manufacturing. Future success will be dictated by the manufacturing community's collective ability to deal with a set of critical issues that require redefining leadership, organiza-

tional structures and the use of advanced technologies. The featured speaker will be David R. Brousell, Vice President /Editorial Director, Manufacturing Executive, part of Thomas Publishing of New York, LLC, that provides a complete set of decision-support informational tools for executives and technology decision-makers at best of breed manufacturing companies. At MEC, Mr. Dave Brousell, a professional journalist since 1975, is in charge of print, web, and conference content. In his more than 30 years in high tech publishing, Dave Brousell has covered numerous industry developments, technology shifts and major product introductions, including the mainframe era and the development of relational databases; the rise of the minicomputer and such companies as Digital Equipment Corp. and Data General; the advent of personal computing, including the introduction of the IBM PC; client-server computing and the evolution of enterprise applications,

and the dawn of the Internet and the worldwide web. Along the way, he has interviewed such notables as ENIAC inventor J. Presper Eckert, IBM's Thomas J. Watson Jr., Microsoft's Bill Gates, Oracle's Larry Ellison, Lotus's Mitchell Kapor, Netscape's James Barksdale, Intel's Andrew Grove, SAP's Hasso Plattner, and cores of other industry pioneers, inventors, and executives.

Farmingdale State College Student Reviews L'Oreal Facilities

One of Farmingdale State College's APICS-NYC/LI Student Chapter's premier events in the last few months of 2011 was its trip to the L'Oreal production facility in Piscataway, New Jersey. L'Oreal is one of the top production companies in the world in terms of hair care, skin care, hair color, and color cosmetics.

Early on, we met Steve Kottakis, the Vice President of Operations who gave an excellent presentation on the history of the company. L'Oreal owns a slew of companies such as Maybelline, Kiehl's, Softsheen and Matrix. Steve explained with great detail how all the company's products are organized by division and how every good that is produced is actually stored at a distribution center; meaning the entire building is geared towards being a production powerhouse. Steve went on to elaborate about the corporate structure. The culture of L'Oreal is one that places reasonable emphasis on individualism and finding your niche in the organization.

Another excellent part of the early presentation was seeing a Farmingdale State student, Matt Wark, working in an excellent

position in the L'Oreal hierarchy. He had acknowledged that his ERP class at Farmingdale State College with Dr. Jill O' Sullivan enabled this to happen. Matt spoke about how he had fostered relationships with their suppliers. One student said, "It was excellent to actually see a Farmingdale student first hand who successfully made the transition from academia to the business world."

The best part of our trip was our excursion through the production floors of L'Oreal. The students were split into two groups and walked throughout the vast facility to see L'Oreal's operations and supply chains first hand. Orfam Yasini, a fellow student marveled, "...This trip opened my eyes to potential careers;... as a productions manager."

Lois Gréaux, another attendee, who represents APICS-NYC/LI Board remarked, "It was unbelievable to see the streamlining of the company's countless materials with their incredibly complex machinery." Professor Sudhir Sachdev, an international consultant and Vice President of Membership commented, "L'Oreal has a diversity of ideas and appears open to new supply approaches and products. They try to be on every level of the customer. They have continued to keep the

names of their acquisitions and it appears to have worked extremely well for them." Dr. Jill O' Sullivan, the President of the Board of Directors of the APICS- NYC/LI Chapter, spoke about the success of the trip and how excellent of an opportunity this is for students. Jill O'Sullivan serves on the Manufacturing Executive Leadership Council with both Vince Serpico and Morris Lenczicki of L'Oreal. "L'Oreal offered an opportunity for our students to visit, tour and view their facility and I am pleased to provide students with this experience, to see a world class company".
